Coronavirus (COVID-19) catch-up premium

The government COVID-19 catch-up premium has been established to mitigate the effects of the unique disruption caused by coronavirus. The grant will be available across the 2020 and 2021 academic years.

"Schools should use this funding for specific activities to support pupils to catch up for lost teaching time over the previous months, in line with the curriculum expectations for the next academic year. While schools can use their funding in a way that suits their cohort and circumstances, they are expected to use this funding for specific activities which will help pupils catch up on missed education."

A summary of best practice, as defined by the EEF, is as follows:

Teaching and whole-school strategies:

- Supporting great teaching
- Pupil assessment and feedback
- Transition support

Targeted approaches:

- One to one and small group tuition
- Intervention programmes
- Extended school time

Wider strategies:

- Supporting parents and carers
- Access to technology
- Summer support

As with all government funding, school leaders and governors must be able to account for how the money is being used. Therefore, the impact and spending strategy for this catch-up premium will be reviewed in meetings with the headteacher throughout the 2020- 2021 academic year, and report to the governing body.

When Ofsted restarts routine inspections in the Spring 2021 term, judgements will be made about the quality of education being provided and how school leaders are using their funding and catch-up funding to ensure the curriculum has a positive impact on all pupils.

Impact of catch up funding on educational attainment will be assessed through a variety of means. Examples include but are not limited to: teacher assessment, progress data, test scores, external examination outcomes, progress against a specific teacher identified by the teacher and by progress measured within the catch up provision, for example Accelerated Reader diagnostic reports.
