The main module for A Level History is entitled *Civil Rights in the USA*.

It is worth 40% of your final grade.

The module covers the period 1865-1992.

This builds on some of your existing knowledge of the experiences of the black people of America and Native Americans. It will extend your knowledge by considering the experiences of women and Trade Unionists.

Your knowledge will be tested in an exam that lasts two and a half hours.

In Section A you will write two essays, allowing 45 minutes for each.

In Section B you will compare and contrast two interpretations.

There are 3 depth studies in this module:

- Civil Rights in the Gilded Age, c1875-1895
- The New Deal and civil rights
- Malcolm X and black power

We would like you to gain an overview of this period through independent research, presented in the form of parallel timelines.
