STURMINSTER NEWTON HIGH SCHOOL PERSONAL, SOCIAL AND HEALTH EDUCATION PROGRAMME YEARS 7-11

Sturminster Newton High School's PSHE programme has been created to ensure that the core themes, recommended by the PSHE Association and the new DFE compulsory (from sept 2020) Sex and RSE are covered during Key Stages 3 and 4 and are extended into ks5. The three core themes are Health and Wellbeing, Relationship and Sex education and Living in the Wider World (Economic wellbeing, careers and the world of work). The PSHE Association's guidance booklet "PSHE Association Programme of Study" (4th Edition 2020) recommends that these themes have broad overlap and flexibility to enable schools to produce schemes of work which are relevant to their own students and their experiences. SNHS will be following 6 core themes.

- Theme 1 Rights, Responsibilities and British Values
- Theme 2 Celebrating Diversity and Equality
- Theme 3 Relationship and Sex Education
- Theme 4 Stayin Safe Online and Offline
- Theme 5 Health and Wellbeing
- Theme 6 Life Beyond School (Careers)

The national curriculum framework states that all schools should make provision for PSHE education, drawing on good practice. In order to help schools to meet this objective, our programme of study identifies the key concepts, skills and attributes that are developed through PSHE education. These help schools to fulfil their statutory responsibility to support pupils' spiritual, moral, cultural, mental and physical development and prepare them for the opportunities, responsibilities and experiences of life, as set out in Section 78 of the Education Act 2002, and their statutory safeguarding responsibilities, in line with the statutory guidance that schools 'should ensure children are taught about safeguarding, including online, through teaching and learning opportunities, as part of providing a broad and balanced curriculum'.

Starting in Year 7, Sturminster Newton High School students will undertake a programme of study which consists of six modules each year. All students will be provided with a workbook to enable them to record and reflect on discussions within PSHE lessons and to assess their own knowledge and understanding, guided by their teachers.

Whilst there is no specific framework for assessment for PSHE, student progress can be measured against their own starting point, based on the development of their level of understanding of each topic.

PSHE education equips pupils to live healthy, safe, productive, capable, responsible and balanced lives. It encourages them to be enterprising and supports them in making effective transitions, positive learning and career choices and in achieving economic wellbeing. A critical component of PSHE education is providing opportunities for children and young people to reflect on and clarify their own values and attitudes and explore the complex and sometimes conflicting range of values and attitudes they encounter now and in the future.

PSHE education contributes to personal development by helping pupils to build their confidence, resilience and self-esteem, and to identify and manage risk, make informed choices and understand what influences their decisions. It enables them to recognise, accept and shape their identities, to understand and accommodate difference and change, to manage emotions and to communicate constructively in a variety of settings. Developing an understanding of themselves, empathy and the ability to work with others will help pupils to form and maintain good relationships, develop the essential skills for future employability and better enjoy and manage their lives.


PSHE education can help schools to reduce or remove many of the barriers to learning experienced by pupils, significantly improving their capacity to learn and achieve. The PSHE education programme makes a significant contribution to pupils' spiritual, moral, social and cultural (SMSC) development, their behaviour and safety and the school's statutory responsibility to promote pupils' wellbeing. In addition the learning provided through a comprehensive PSHE education provision is essential to safeguarding pupils, as Ofsted has set out.

The aim for PSHE education is to provide pupils with:-


- accurate, balanced and relevant knowledge
- opportunities to turn that knowledge into personal understanding
- opportunities to explore, clarify and if necessary challenge, their own and others' values, attitudes, beliefs, rights and responsibilities
- the skills, language and strategies they need in order to live healthy, safe, fulfilling, responsible and balanced lives
- opportunities to develop positive personal attributes such as resilience, self-confidence, self-esteem, and empathy


