OUR SCHOOL DEFINITION

Bullying is any deliberate, hurtful, upsetting, frightening or threatening behaviour by an individual or group towards other people. It is repeated over a period of time and it is very difficult for the victims to defend themselves. (remember STOP – it happens Several Times On Purpose). Bullying is mean and results in worry, fear, pain and distress to the victims.

WHAT IS BULLYING?







The repeated negative use of speech, sign language, or verbal gestures to intentionally hurt others.

The repeated negative use of actions, which are neither physical nor verbal, to intentionally hurt others.

The repeated negative use of body contact to intentionally hurt others.

BYSTANDER VS UPSTANDER

A bystander is someone who sees or knows about bullying or other forms of violence that is happening to someone else, but takes no action to address it or report it.

An upstander is someone who recognises when something is wrong and acts to make it right. When an upstander sees or hears about someone being bullied, they speak up and do their best to help, protect and support the person.



THE BYSTANDER EFFECT

Where people don't help someone else in need because they think 'someone else must have/ will help them'.

WHAT IS THE IMPACT OF TOO MANY BYSTANDERS?

When there is an emergency or difficult situation, the more bystanders there are, the less likely it is that any of them will actually take action and help.






FAMOUS UPSTANDERS_

- 4. Say 'You can talk to me, but I can't promise to keep a secret as if you or someone else is at risk of harm, then I have to tell a responsible adult in school'.
